Building Use and Condition

Kenroy Elementary is located on the corner of Jonathan Avenue and Fifth Street NE in East Wenatchee, Washington. The building was originally opened in 1954 and has undergone several remodels and expansion during the years. We recently added a beautiful gymnasium and during the summer of 2003, our old gym was converted to a beautiful new library. Our building is available to many outside community organizations such as East Wenatchee Parks and Recreation, Big River Soccer Association, The YMCA, Boy and Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Camp Fire Girls and meeting space for community clubs and groups. Beginning the 2004-05 school year, Kenroy will be a K-4 school. With the addition of Clovis Point Intermediate School, the Eastmont School District realigned the grade configuration.

School Improvement Plan

The outstanding Kenroy staff works in teams to develop, implement, evaluate, and refine our school improvement goals and plan. Each team, as determined by staff interest, is responsible for one area and makes recommendations for consideration by the whole staff. We have developed general goals for each academic area and have created specific activities to be accomplished annually. Although our test scores are currently above the Average Yearly Progress determined for us by the Federal Government, we are continuing to set higher goals.

Our goals for 2005-06 are:

Reading: We surpassed our goal of 87% in reading by scoring 88.3% on the WASL. Our goal is to maintain or increase our score up to 90%.

Math: We surpassed our goal of 60% by scoring 76.6% on the WASL. Our goal is to maintain or increase our score up to 80%.

Writing: This continues to be the main focus. Staff has continued to receive training in Step Up to Writing. We surpassed our goal of 60% in writing by scoring 64.9% on the WASL. Our goal is to maintain or increase our score to 70%.

I-728 funds will be used to provide extended day learning classes and summer school. In addition, our staff development funds were used to send teachers to observe highly effective schools and to provide technology training.
