GARN CHRISTENSEN Superintendent Eastmont Schools The 2014-15 school year gets started September 3rd. Even though the world is different than when we may have gone to school, the recipe for student success remains the same:

- A good night's rest the night before a school day
- Nutritious meals and snacks
- Caring and supportive adults who ask about school work and future plans
- A quiet and orderly place for a student to do homework

Research on success at school is wide-ranging, yet two things stand out.

First, good attendance is critical. Those students who miss less than one day per month graduate at higher rates than those with high levels of absences.

Second, students who read at least 20 minutes every day are far more likely to graduate from high school than those who do not read. The numbers for both high school and college graduation rates go up significantly as an individual's reading ability increases.

Parents need to read daily to young children, implement nightly reading as they get older, and read in front of your children so they see it as something important. A weekly trip to our local libraries or bookstore to let a young person self-select their own reading materials is always helpful at developing strong readers.

My hope is for a safe, positive, and productive 2014-15 school year. Please do not hesitate to call my office if you have a suggestion on what we can do better or hear of something that concerns you.

## Get ready. It's here!

This is not your parent's Eastmont High School. Even a 2014 EHS graduate would feel alien wandering around their revamped alma mater. Yes, it still sits at 955 3rd St. NE, but other than the address few similarities remain between the old Eastmont High School and the new building which has undergone a phoenixlike rebirth over months and months of construction. The impressive remodel is the long-awaited result of the \$30.8 million Facility Improvement Bond passed by voters in November of 2010. "It's the same footprint, but everything's in a different spot," second-year principal Lance Noell said. "I can't wait for the kids to get here. I'm so excited just to get going."

A quick glance from the newly paved parking lot at the state-of-the art facility shows the high school's extreme makeover. A tall and spacious entrance welcomes students into a building which looks like it would fit nicely on a collegiate campus.

"It has more of a college feel," said construction worker Lee Everhart. "I think it's going to create a happy environment for everyone."

A remodel is just what EHS needed. The former school, built in 1977, had a myriad of construction and space issues that challenged both students and faculty alike. At the time of the bond vote in 2010, the roof was outdated,

> pipes were leaking and the electrical system had major deficiencies and overloaded circuits.

Then there was the space problem. Since real estate at the old building was at a premium, some teachers had to instruct in glorified closets or old offices which led to poor ventilation, uncomfortable temperatures and circuit breakers that would go off learn," Noell said. "They can focus on their kids and their teaching, otherwise you're worrying about popping a breaker or, 'It's hot!""

Students and faculty will be treated to a spacious layout which features a lot more windows and natural light, especially on the east wing of the building. Catwalks on the second story connect classrooms to each other. Extra staircases have been added to help with student traffic flow. Other features included a refurbished auditorium, an auxiliary gym, bigger administrative offices and an impressive weight room upstairs with a cardio facility. Besides the remodel, the bond also included new equipment. Eastmont now has a new chair and desk for every student. About 64 new computers will be integrated into the classrooms. The gym features a new set of bleachers and almost all of the equipment in the athletic facilities are new.

While reveling in the shiny new facility with all its proverbial bells and whistles, Noell was appreciative of the voters who sacrificed to pass the bond. As the skipper of the "new" Eastmont High School, he visibly ready to set sail on the building's

was visibly ready to set sail on the building's maiden voyage.

"It's humbling. I'm honored. Your high school is the flagship of the District," Noell said. "Nothing beats a good teacher. If you give a good teacher good equipment it makes them that much better. The facility's not the most important. It's the people. But you have great kids and great teacher and give them this? Wow."

As for Everhart, as his two-year journey winds down, he looks forward to seeing his Eastmont High School experience come full circle. "In the end just to stand back and look at something like this and say, 'I made it happen,'" he said. "I can't wait for my kids to come up to school here. I'm excited to see them go to the school that I put a lot of hard work into."

For Everhart, Eastmont High School has been a family affair. An Eastmont School District lifer, he graduated as a Wildcat in 2002 preceding his three siblings and following his parents. Everhart began working construction in 2003 and earned his commercial license in 2006. In addition to Eastmont High School, the bond also included massive improvements of Sterling Intermediate School and Grant Elementary, the latter Everhart attended in the 1990s. He recalled feeling surreal excitement upon learning that he would be working on two of his former schools. "It was awesome," Everhart said. He remembered saying to himself, "I can't believe this. I haven't been here (Grant) in years. To remodel schools you spent nine years of your education in is pretty neat."



## FREE/REDUCED MEAL APPLICATIONS

All households are required to fill out a new application each year. Students receiving meal benefits last year must complete a new application for the new school year. Without a new application, students will continue to receive the same benefit only until October.

Tips for filling out the application:

- 1. Make sure all student information is complete including the student income section. Please indicate \$0 if there is no student income to report.
- 2. Make sure to provide all household members and their income.
- 3. Make sure to sign your application at the bottom.

Not following these tips may result in an incomplete application that will delay approval for your student. Applications that are not complete will be mailed back so that additional required information can be provided.

We work as fast as we can to get the applications approved, but please remember we have up to 10 days once your application is received. Once the application is processed, a letter is sent home that notifies the family of the approval or denial.

Students will need to pay full price for all meals while the application is being approved. Please make sure to send money with your student for meals or a sack lunch for them to eat until you have received notification of approval status.

## Fruits and Vegetables at Rock Island Elementary

Does your child know what romenesca is? What is an aprium? Or a pluot? This year students at Rock Island Elementary School will discover, taste, and learn about these vegetables and fruits. The school has been awarded the USDA Fresh Fruits and Vegetable Grant. This grant provides all students at Rock Island with an afternoon snack of fresh fruit and/or fresh vegetables.

Students and their teachers are encouraged to taste and discover various vegetables and fruits throughout the school year. Studies have shown that students who are part of this program are likely to eat 25% more fruits and vegetables in their diet than students who have not participated. We think this is a great way to teach healthy eating habits that can impact these students for life.

- a. Jewelry and piercings must be removed to participate in PE/athletic activities if required by teacher/coach.
- b. All new team, club, and activity uniforms must be consistent with Eastmont colors of red and Columbia blue, meet league standards, and be approved by the coach/advisor, athletic director, and principal.
- c. Grades 6-12 PE uniforms are required and shall consist of red shorts, grey t-shirt, and grey sweatpants. Logos are not required, although any uniforms sold in the District will have only an "Eastmont" logo. PE loaner uniforms will be provided if requested by a parent.

The dress code procedure will be reviewed with building staff on a yearly basis. If the student's dress or grooming is objectionable under these provisions, the principal will request the student to make appropriate corrections. If the student refuses, the principal will take appropriate corrective action including disciplinary action for a dress code violation. Principals may grant exceptions for occasional special events and activities.

Students who violate provisions of the dress code relating to extracurricular activities may be excluded from the extracurricular activity until proper attire is worn.

## Summer School Lots of Learning for the Students And Experience for the Teachers, too

Summer school. It sharpens skills. It builds confidence. It improves performance. Oh, and it's great for new teachers, too.

Hundreds of students, as well as a pair of rookie teachers, reaped the rewards of the Eastmont School District's 2014 summer school session. Approximately 54 students went to Rock Island Academy of Learning while another 145 gathered at Grant Elementary School. Both programs lasted five weeks, Monday through

Thursday and were designed for students in grades 1-4 to gain intensive help in reading, writing and math. "It helps them to stay where they are or give them a better base," said Holly Cornehl, lead teacher at the Grant program. "Every day they get that extra attention."

At Grant, two fresh-faced newbies had a unique chance to jumpstart their careers this summer in a somewhat low key environment before the chaos of the regular school year. Incoming first grade teachers Travis Kane and Joel Barnes taught under the tutelage of seasoned veterans Tracy Thompson and Jane Spry, both first grade teachers at Lee. "Of all my summer schools that I have done, this was probably the best. The four of us just worked together so well and we complemented each other," said Spry. "Travis and Joel really wanted hands-on teaching experience before fall, so summer school worked perfect. They were both so nice - and they'd bring us

coffee in the morning to say thank you." Both men were thankful to be able to hone their skills. They also benefited from previously working together. The two subbed together once and had attending training together in Seattle earlier in the year. They also have something

in common, which Kane appreciates. "Especially as a male - there are not too many first grade male teachers and having somebody else that is going through that process with you is just really helpful," Kane said.

For the students, summer school started out with sack breakfasts, and then teachers rotated their students through various stations every 20-25 minutes. Reading and math skills were emphasized strongly during these sessions, some of which took place in computer labs. For the first few days of the summer session,

Spry and Thompson, who have over five decades of teaching experience combined, praised the young men for how they related to the students and were happy pass on some advice. "Classroom management is the most important thing and once you get the kids managed and under control then the teaching and learning will happen," Thompson said. But teaching is more than managing behavior and providing instruction and assessment. Good teachers have to be approachable to their students and usually have a strong sense of humor.

Barnes thrilled his students by wearing an odd pair of socks every day. One pair of socks was decorated with tacos while another featured mustaches. "He has ugly socks every day," Kane said. "The ones I liked had eyeballs on the socks so he told the kids that he always had his eyes on them."

Students were tested in reading, writing and math both before and after the summer session. The results showed that the extra schooling paid academic dividends. "Most of the kids I believe were able to maintain or make increases," Spry said. "I think the summer school program is just crucial for those kids. It gets them into a routine and they don't get out of practice. It's kind of like riding a bike.'

The same can be said for the teachers. "When I tell somebody that I did summer school for kindergarten to first grade,

I feel like that was an absolute Godsend right there," said Kane, who will teach at Kenroy. "It allowed me to see my strengths with those kids but also the things that I really need to improve on."




