

From Eastmont Band to the Chicago Symphony Orchestra

This Eastmont Alum discovered a passion for the bassoon that took him to the big time.

Dennis Michael graduated from Eastmont High School in 1971, and has been nominated for the Eastmont Foundation Distinguished Alumnus Award, 2018 by fellow classmate, Scott Kane. Michael is the second bassoonist of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. While attending Eastmont, Michael was a part of the Jazz Band, Wind Ensemble and the All Northwest Orchestra. In a letter announcing his nomination to the superintendent, Garn Christensen, and board members of the Eastmont School District, Michael's eighth grade band teacher states, "He already played the bassoon like a professional." After Eastmont, Michael went on to obtain degrees from Eastern Washington University and Yale University and studied under multiple principle teachers - notably, Wendal Jones - one of the leading American

classical music composers, conductors, and professional musicians of the 20th century.

Michael was the recipient of a Fulbright Fellowship for advanced study at the Hochschule für Musik in Vienna and performed with the Vienna State Opera. He has been given the opportunity to perform with the Da Camera Society of Houston, a thematically programmed chamber concert designed to attract new listeners. He also performed at numerous festivals such as Tanglewood, The Bard Festival in New York, Flagstaff Festival, and was the featured artist at SummerFest La Jolla for 10 seasons. Michael continues to play with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and functions as head of the woodwinds at the Chicago College of Performing Arts at Roosevelt University.

Summer Program Enjoyed by Many

By DOMINICK BONNY

Three years ago Carmen Johnson and Carol Mooney saw a need for some Eastmont students to have access to safe and fun learning environments during the summer months. So they stepped up, wrote some grants, formed partnerships, and the Summer Library Program was born.

"Carol and I got together and really noticed that there was a great need for our students to be connected to books and learning and school over the summer," Johnson said. "A lot of our kids would come in the fall and make comments like: 'I haven't touched a book all summer. I haven't been reading. I got bored over the summer.""

Upon further research, the pair discovered that kids in Rock Island don't even have access to the public library system because the town of about 800 doesn't pay into the local library tax. It was easy to see how children were going through the whole summer without touching a book.

"And that got us thinking, 'If there really truly is nowhere for kids to go, maybe we as a public school system, as teachers, we can step in and help them get access," Johnson said.

So they reached out to the principals

at Rock Island and Clovis Point and got the go ahead to open the libraries at those schools for a few hours each week. They wrote a grant and got \$5,000 from the Community Foundation of North Central Washington to buy books. Then they wrote more grants and got funding to purchase games and art supplies. Then they

partnered with

Small Miracles, a local nonprofit that provides nutritious brown bag lunches for children throughout the summer months, mostly at parks and libraries throughout the Wenatchee Valley.

Johnson said many children come for the whole two-hour block every week. At Clovis Point, the groups average between 40 and 50 kids per session. She said they have five to 10 "library families"

who come to the sessions religiously.

As they wrap up their third summer of the program, the pair want the community to know they're not going anywhere.

"I want the community to know that this program is available to all kids of all grades, K through 12," Mooney said. "You can check out books here, there's internet access and it's just a fun, safe place for your kids to be."

2018-19 Attendance Policy

Did you know?

- Your children can suffer academically if they miss 10 percent of school days in a year, or about 18 days. That can be just one day every two weeks and can happen before you know it.
- It doesn't matter if these absences are excused or unexcused. They all represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn.
- Attendance matters as early as kindergarten. Studies show many children who miss too many days in kindergarten and first grade can struggle academically in later years. They often have trouble mastering reading by the end of third grade.
- Preschool is a great time to start building a habit of good attendance. Studies show that poor attendance in preschool

School hours

All students between the ages of 8 and under 18 years **are required by Washington state law** to attend school regularly. If a parent or guardian enrolls a child at 6 or 7 years of age, the child **is required by law** to attend the full school session. To ensure compliance, each school takes regular attendance and the district has set a policy for excused and unexcused absences.

Parents or guardians must provide the school with an excuse for any absence, late arrival or early departure in the form of a note or personal contact with school officials. (Please refer to your child's individual school student handbook.) Any absence not properly explained within three days of the student returning to school will not be excused without approval from an administrator. preescolar puede predecir el ausentismo en grados posteriores.

Eastmont School District Meal Charge Policy

Eastmont School District recognizes that adequate nutrition is essential to a child's mental, physical and academic growth. Parents are responsible for either providing their children with meals, applying for free or reduced price meals when appropriate, or providing money for their child to purchase meals.

Each student may have a point of sale cafeteria account to manage meal charges. Parents may view their child's food service account balance at any time by utilizing the District-provided online point of sale software (SchoolCafé). Access to this software is available on the Food Service Department webpage at www. eastmont206.org.

Families may apply for free/reduced meals anytime during the school year. However, applications are mailed to all registered families in the district each August. In addition, applications are available online on the Food Service Department webpage at www.eastmont206.org. Paper applications are also available at the District Administration Office or at school offices.

A negative account is the responsibility of the student's parent/guardian. Per District Policy 6705, under no circumstance will the student be denied a meal due to a lack of money or a negative food account balance. The parent/guardian will be contacted regularly when the balance is less than \$0.

Reminder for **Rock Island** and other **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)** school students moving to another school like Clovis or Sterling: a free/reduced application must be completed and approved for meal benefits to continue.

The Eastmont Board of Directors has reviewed recommended District safety improvements during meetings over the summer months. Safety improvements in process for 2018-19 include:

- System monitoring of students who have a history of threatening or harming others
- Implementing Check and Connect practices as an expectation for all schools and educators to reach out and better monitor withdrawn, despondent, or angry students
 Strengthening our partnerships with community counseling and family support organizations
 Working to implement a partnership with local law enforcement as school resource officers, as well as gain legislative support for increased presence of law enforcement on school campuses

As it's been shared before, we know a very important prevention strategy is connecting and communicating with our community. Knowing this, we ask that if you hear, read, or observe something that could be a threat to a student or a school, please report this information immediately to a school principal or to the Superintendent's Office. You can do this in person, phone call, email, or click on the Stop Bullying – Safe School Zone image/ link on our website to submit an anonymous report. We will immediately investigate your report and work with law enforcement, if needed. Thanks for your help in keeping our schools and community safe.

- Improved emergency communications on all campuses
- Reduced access to the high school campus
- Implementation of strong disciplinary actions for students who make threats to harm others
- Improved classroom and office door security
- Revised safety procedures to reflect updated best practices




