**Ro-Z Scott Eaton** eatons@eastmont206.org Eastmont High School operates on semesters. School days consists of six 56 minute classes, five days per week. One-half credit is awarded for each semester course successfully completed.

Eastmont offers Dual Credit which provides students with the potential to earn high school and college credit at the same time through successful completion of a course and/or corresponding exams. Options at Eastmont include nine Advanced Placement classes, five College in the High School classes, and seventeen Career and Technical courses. In addition 11% of our students receive dual credit through the Running Start Program.

Approximately 150 students are served through the Eastmont Alternative Learning Opportunities Program (EOP). Students that are credit deficient, single parents, have jobs to help support family, or unable to be on the main campus for various reason are served at EOP.

Eastmont Athletics offers 10 Male teams, 13 Female teams, and 2 Coed team, over 500 student participate in one or more sports.

Approximately 348 students participate in one or more of the 24 Clubs/Activities offered at Eastmont High School.
