

Registration script 2024-2025 (class of 2025)

Welcome to this video on registering for classes at Eastmont High School for the 2024 - 2025 school year. All of the information that will be covered is available on our website including this video at www.eastmont206.org/ehs/counseling and we will be using this link right here for class registration.

This is the main registration page. Any and all information needed for registration will be here. As you scroll down, make sure you pay attention to the tabs associated with your graduation year. Also continue to scroll down to find all the resources that are needed for registration.

Grad Requirements

The first document that you will want to familiarize yourself with is the graduation requirements. Scroll down to the tabs and select the graduation year. Then you will want to go down to "Graduation Requirements".

This document outlines the required number of credits for each subject matter. Please note that foreign language is not a graduation requirement but it is recommended if you're planning on going to a four-year college after high school.

Course List

To see what classes are available to you, scroll down the registration page and find the tab with your graduation year on it and then click the "Course List".

Here is a list of all the courses that are offered at Eastmont high school for you. The course list can also help you to determine what requirements each class is covering. Some classes can count as multiple requirements. Please note that there are some classes that are by permission only and they are marked with a P.

Course Description Guide

If you want to know more about a class or what will be taught in the class, we recommend that you check out the "Course Catalog/ Course Description Guide".

The course description guide lists all the courses that we teach at Eastmont High School along with a description of those classes. There is a lot of information in this book, but the most practical way to use it is probably either to look at the table of contents or jump down to the index and look up the class by the subject. Here the course description guide will tell you the class, the grade level it applies to, if there are any prerequisites needed, and it also gives you a brief description of what the class is about.

Registration Worksheet 12 Grade Class of 2025

The document you're looking at now is a registration worksheet for next year's 12th graders or the class of 2025. This document needs to be completed and it will be collected at a later date.

We are going to look at each section individually but you will probably not be able to complete it all as we go over it.

To start, clearly write your first name, last name, and your student ID number. Next check the box for what is your plan after high school. Then if you are a student who is interested in attending an off-site program like Running Start or the Skill/Tech Center, please check the box that suits you. Note checking the box does not enroll you in the program. You will need to apply and be approved for the off-site programs. Information about these off-site programs will be discussed later in this video. For now, all students will need to complete a registration worksheet.

Core Classes

English all students must take English. English is a yearlong class and students must take it both semesters. Choose if you want to take regular English, Honors English or Advanced Placement English.

All seniors must take Senior Social Studies. Everyone needs to take civics plus one more Social Studies class. You can choose to take Law & Order or Current World Problems in addition to Civics. If you choose to do Advanced Placement (AP) American Government, this course is yearlong and replaces the Senior Social Studies requirement of taking Civics plus one. Please choose carefully what you plan on doing for your Senior Social Studies.

All students are required to take three full years of math to graduate. Some seniors may have already completed this requirement. If you have not completed this requirement please select the next level of math based on our [math sequence guide](#). If you have already completed three years of math you can select another math class or you can check the box that says you are not taking math. If you choose to not take math you will need to write in two Alternatives on the designated line towards the bottom of the page..

Science - All students are required to take 3 years of Science in order to graduate. Some seniors may have already taken three years of science. If you still need another year of science please select a class based on our [science flowchart](#) . If you have already completed three years of science you can select another Science class or you can check the box that says you are not taking science. If you are not taking science because you have met the requirement, mark the box and put your alternatives on the designated lines towards the bottom right of the page.

Electives classes can include classes from any subject matter but often it includes classes in music, foreign language, shop, and PE. Please look at the [class list](#) to see what classes are available. Write the name down once for every semester you plan on taking it. Remember some classes are year long, please pay attention to that marking on the class list.

This replacement class section is only for students who have met their three year math and/or science requirements and are not taking anymore math and/or science courses. In the designated section titled alternative classes, fill in the classes that you will be taking if you are not taking math and science. If you are taking Math and/or Science please leave these spaces blank.

How to fill out the bottom of the form. This next section might be the most critical. You will be selecting exactly which period you will be taking each of the classes that you want. In order to do this you will need to have access to Qumulative. Qumulative shows all of the classes offered and indicates exactly which period or periods that class is taught. For example you can see that English 12 is offered every period of the day. You would be able to write in English 12 for any period. English is a yearlong class so you would write it in semester one and two for the same class period. If you select English 12 during 4th period you will have to select English 12 during 4th period all year. This is true of all year long courses.

You may want to schedule around classes that are offered at limited times. For example, band is only offered one period. If you want to take band, start with that and work your core classes around it. Also, keep in mind that what you select for 4th period will impact what lunch you get. If your 4th period is upstairs, you will have second lunch. If your 4th period is downstairs, you will have first lunch.

Be sure to fill in all the boxes on the schedule at the bottom of the page and that each class is offered at that time you wrote down on the paper.

Things for the Counselor to know. This is a place where you can write a note to your counselor.

A counselor will be back next Wednesday to teach you how to sign up for classes using Qumulative and we will be using the Registration Worksheet to schedule our classes.

Your registration window will open at 2:30pm Wednesday March 13th and close at 7:45am Wednesday March 20th. You will not have class time to register for classes. You will need to register for your classes outside of school time.

If you need help with registration counselors will be available after school, in the library on the 13th and 14th and before school on the 14th and 15th.

If you are unsure of what classes to take next, ask your current teachers.

If you do not sign up for classes by 7:45 on March 20th you will not be able to sign up for classes until all juniors have had an opportunity to sign up. If you miss your registration window you can turn your registration worksheet into the counseling office and your counselor will input your classes when time allows, however the classes that you want may not be available.

One final note: The Registration worksheet needs to be turned into the counselor/counseling office after you have registered. The master schedule may change and counselors use this sheet to make decisions about your schedule. It is important that you turn it in.

Off-Site Programs

Now I am going to take a moment to talk about our off-site programs such as Running Start and the Skill/Tech Center. If you are not interested in doing our off-site programs, please feel free to stop the video here.

For those of you who are interested in doing Running Start or the Skill/Tech Center, on our registration page, scroll over to the tab with your graduation year on it and then scroll down to the off-site programs drop down list and select the program you are interested in.

Running Start is a program where high school students from Eastmont attend Wenatchee Valley Community College. Students who do running start are able to earn credit at both the high school and the college. Students who are successful at running start usually have a GPA of at least 3.0 and have taken rigorous classes at the high school. Running start can be a great program but there are some downsides to it. You should consider carefully whether or not it is a good fit for you. If you do running start, you will be expected to step up and do college level rigor. That means college level reading, college level writing, and you will be responsible for turning in all your assignments on the deadline; the college does not give extensions. If you are still considering doing running start, you will need to make sure you meet the qualifications stated on the [running start website](#). Then you will need to follow the enrollment process to get approved to do running start and then apply to the college to get accepted.

The second off-site program that we offer is the Tech center. The Tech center offers several programs including automotive technology, cosmetology, and criminal justice. The way this program works is that the student is transported to the tech center in Wenatchee in the afternoon. These students complete periods 1, 2, and 3 here at the high school and then periods 4, 5, and 6 are at the tech center. The students that do best are ones that have not failed classes previously and have good attendance. If you want more information on the tech center, please visit the [tech center website](#). You will also need to apply and get approved in order to do the tech center. Seats are limited and not all students get in.

Reminder: Students must apply and be accepted into the off-site programs. Checking the box on the registration worksheet does not enroll you into the program.

Reminder: Turn your registration worksheet into the counseling office after you have registered for your classes.
